Second Circular: 7 December 2010: Reminder

The British Cave Research Association is pleased to confirm that its next one-day annual Cave Science Symposium will be held at Cardiff University (<u>www.cardiff.ac.uk</u>) on Saturday 5 March 2011. This will be **a joint meeting hosted by the South Wales Geologists' Association** (<u>www.swga.org.uk</u>). A Cave Science Field Trip on Sunday 6 March to Dan yr Ogof, Tunnel (Cathedral) Cave and Ogof Ffynnon Ddu 2 in south Wales is also planned, as announced separately.

Presentations are invited on any cave science topic. Those that fall within one of the four BCRA cave science themes will be especially welcome (see the cave science policy via <u>www.bcra.org.uk/detail/cstri info.html</u>), as will those from undergraduates and other students. This year's special theme will be '*The science of the Welsh caves*', and it is hoped to devote half the Symposium to this topic. Full papers are not required, but related submissions to *Cave and Karst Science* are also invited. Titles and abstracts of up to one side of A4 should be sent as Word files by email by **Friday 7 January 2011**. These should include full first names, contact details and affiliations of all authors, with <u>presenters</u> underlined, and may be 'extended' to include references. Talks will probably be allocated 15–20 minutes, and poster presentations 3–5 minutes.

Each year the Symposium covers a wide range of cave science topics, providing much of interest for academic and amateur scientists and for enquiring cavers. Registration will take place at the start of the meeting. A small admission charge will cover refreshments in the morning and afternoon. At the conclusion of the Symposium, we have been invited to tour Amgueddfa Cymru - National Museum Wales (<u>www.museumwales.ac.uk</u>), which is on the same site.
